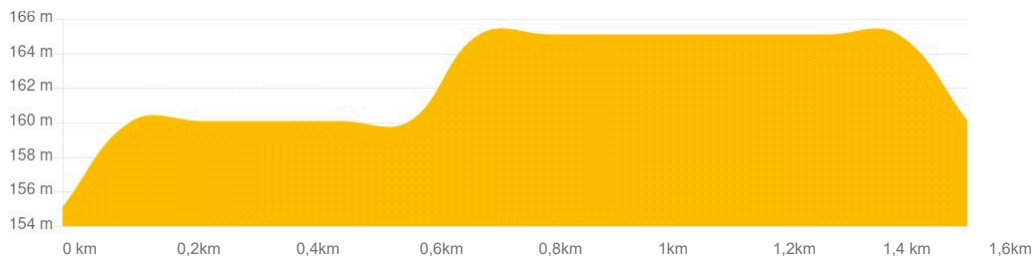

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## STEPS

### **1 Departure from the Alsace Verte Tourist Office**

From the Tourist Office, cross the courtyard to discover the "Maison des gîtes Ungerer", with its magnificent, completely renovated Alsatian farmhouse and pretty garden with children's games.

### **2 2 route de Hoffen**

Traditional farm courtyard. The residential buildings and outbuildings, including a stable and pigsty, surround an open courtyard. Most of the houses in the village date from the 18th and 19th centuries.

### **3 50 rue principale**

The houses are entered through a side door. The layout of the rooms is identical and the "Stub", the living room, looks out onto the street. The houses are large because several generations lived in them.

### **4 Presbytery and 43 rue principale**

Presbytery : dating from 1743, unlike the houses in the village, the presbytery is built entirely of stone and has a 4-sloped roof. 43 rue principale : a beautiful, opulent farmhouse that has been faithfully restored. In the background is a raised lean-to building used as servants' quarters.

**5 Rue principale, after house N°27**

Look at the exposed cob in the passageway and the bluish whitewash that protected the stables from insects.

**6 30 rue principale**

Typical sandstone paved courtyard.

**7 Rue St Paul, "Plattewaigl" paved path**

Paved path linking the village, the church and the cemetery through the orchards.

**8 Church**

The sobriety of the building is due to the fact that, since the 16th century, the village has been entirely Protestant. The building dates from 1757 and the bell tower from 1874. The church has been completely renovated.

**9 Cemetery**

Group of remarkable tombs, late 19th/early 20th century.

**10 Rue de l'ange, opposite No. 5**

You'll notice an openwork façade. These openings ventilate the room.

**11 At the end of the rue de l'ange**

Typical of the region, this outrigger well is surrounded by a beautiful group of houses.

**12 73 rue principale and rue du moulin**

73 rue principale: remarkable diamond-shaped half-timbering on the gable. Rue du Moulin : charming small houses.

**13 Rue des moutons**

The house at 12 rue des moutons dates back to 1713. It is probably the oldest house in the village.

**14 Place du village, town hall**

The curved windows reflect the space and protect the privacy of occupants.
